After returning from a wedding trip to Gatlinburg, Tennessee, the newlyweds will reside at Georgetown Apartments in Kings Mountain.

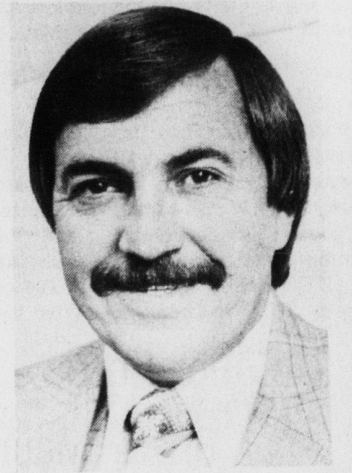
