

## 21 Units Approved

Kings Mountain has been approved for 21 new low income housing units for the elderly.

The one-bedroom units are scheduled for construction at the corner of Tracy and King Sts., according to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Application for the units was

submitted by the firm of Anderson, Benton and Holmes, Inc. of Winston-Salem for Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments.

The preliminary proposal was submitted to HUD on April 27 by the Winston-Salem firm. HUD has now notified Anderson, Benton and Holmes that final proposal forms denoting

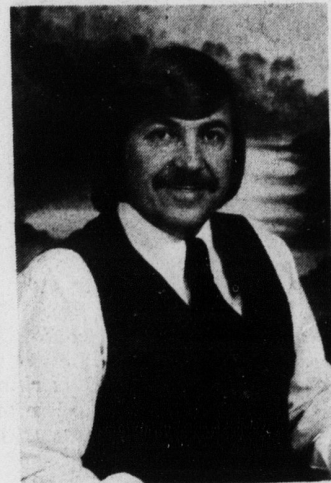
willingness to comply with certain guidelines is expected in Greensboro no later than Nov. 1.

According to J. P. Sabella, acting area director for HUD, annual contributions to the Kings Mountain Housing Authority totaling \$58,212 has been reserved for this project.

Girl Scouts Piedmont Council, \$5,800; Kings Mountain High School Band, \$3,000; Kings Mountain Rescue Squad, \$9,100; Kings Mountain High School Chorus, \$700; Salvation Army, \$1,200; Cleveland County Association for Retarded Citizens, \$600; and Cleveland County Community Organization for Drug Abuse Prevention, \$500, all local requests, and North Carolina Community Services, \$4,100; which is Kings Mountain's fair share to the Children's

Home Society of N. C., \$1,044.90; Florence Crittenton Services of N. C., \$501.11; N. C. Mental Health Association, \$490.69; United Health Services of N. C., \$261.23; N. C. United Way, \$802.61; Research Fund of N. C. United, \$348.80; Epilepsy Association of N. C., \$226.39; American Social Health Association, \$80.49; The National Council of Aging, \$89.66; and United Services Organizations, \$275.16. The budget also provides for \$1,750 for administrative cost of United Fund and \$600 for emergencies.

To a question, President Larry Wood said that the new Kings Mountain Emergency Medical Services, Inc., second rescue squad being formed in the city, has not yet asked for inclusion in United Fund for 1978 but that matter would probably come before the board at a future time.

"One Gift Works Many Wonders" is the theme of the 1978 United Fund. Chairman Cheshire said he is confident that this year's quota will be surpassed, as was last year's UF campaign in Kings Mountain.

## Four Conners Charged

## Family Feud In Court

Hearing for four members of a Kings Mountain family on charges of discharging firearms into occupied property was continuing Wednesday in Cleveland County District Court as the Mirror-Herald went to press.

Cleveland County Sheriff's Department said that Don Conner, 43, of Waco Rd., faced charges of discharging a firearm into an occupied building, a service station, his wife, Betty, 41, was charged with aiding and abetting

in the felony, and Conner's father, Ralph Conner, and brother, Roger Conner, faced charges of discharging firearms into occupied vehicle, a car, owned and operated by Donald and Betty Conner.

Det. Paul Barbee, Sgt. Glenn Poston, and Deputy Joe King arrested Don Conner at a Kings Mountain magistrate's office Monday night where the couple was drawing up warrants.

All four Conners were released on \$1,000 bonds

and district hearing slated in Shelby Wednesday. Steve Dolley is the attorney for the Don Conners and Charlie Horn is representing Roger and Ralph Conner.

According to investigating officers, deputies looking for Don Conner, owner of Kings Mountain Men's Club, to serve a misdemeanor warrant drawn by his son, Don Conner, Jr., Monday afternoon averted a gunfight when they attempted to arrest him and succeeded after Barbee negotiated with Conner.

It was later in the day, about 7 p. m. that gunfire reportedly erupted at Conner's Amoco Station on York Rd., owned by Ralph Conner, with the station allegedly hit with fire from a .45 caliber automatic rifle and a vehicle hit with fire from a .38 caliber gun, according to officers. There were no injuries from the incident and there were reportedly several customers inside the building at the time.

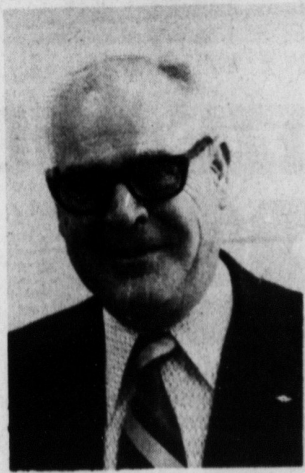
