Participants were judged on how far and how accurately they could punt, pass and placekick the football. One point was awarded per foot for distance and a point was subtracted for each foot they were off the center line.

Winners here advance to zone competition, which will be held Sat., Oct. 15 in Morganton. Winners there go to area, then district and national competition. The 12 national finalists will compete during halftime of the Super Bowl game.

Kings Mountain Junior High's footballers won one and tied one last week, the jayvees trouncing Grandview 34-8 here Wednesday and the varsity tying Grandview 6-6 on Thursday in Hickory.

The results left the jayvees with a 3-0 record heading into a Wednesday game at Burns and the varsity at 2-0-1 heading into a home game Saturday with Burns.

Penalties plagued the varsity Thursday as the Patriots were assessed 160 yards and had three touchdowns called back.

Chris Wright scored the lone KM touchdown on a two-yard run. KM attempted to run for the two-point conversion, and went into the end-zone the first two tries only to have it nullified. They failed the third time.

An apparent touchdown following a fumble recovery early in the first quarter was nullified and Coach Joe Speight said he felt like that dampened KM's spirits.

"We got down and it took a long time to come back," he said. "It seems as though everytime we'd make a

gain, we'd have a penalty."

It was an exciting game for defense-minded fans, as Kings Mountain intercepted five passes and recovered three fumbles, and Grandview intercepted two passes and recovered five fumbles.

"We weren't hitting all that hard," said Speight. "We just couldn't hold on to the football."

Speight cited Wright, Alan Van Dyke, Boo Robinson and Jimmy West for their defensive play. West intercepted two of the passes.

The jayvees got two touchdowns each from Doug Wright and Carvin Petty and one from Todd Bell in their easy victory on Wednesday.

Wright scored on runs of 50 and 55 yards, and had two others called back. Petty scored on runs of 20 and 45 yards and Bell scored from 30 yards out.

Coach David Hart's team rolled up a 28-0 halftime lead, then Hart called on his reserves to finish out the second half.

Bell, Wright and Demetrius Goode were cited for their defensive play.

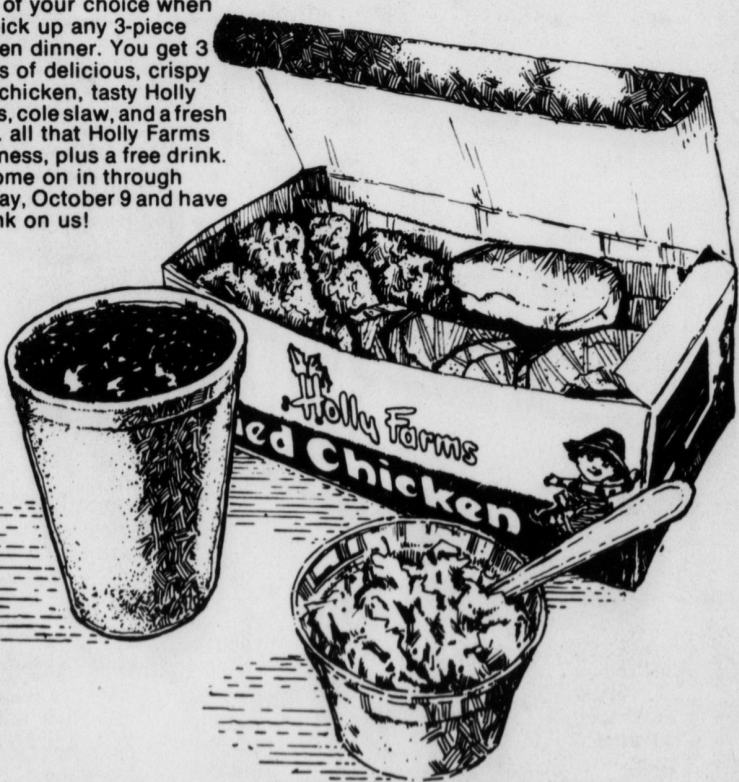
