City To Identify Historical Structures

Beginning Mon., June 4, Carol Perrin will be inching her way through Kings Mountain, street by street, taking notes and snapping photographs.

Ms. Perrin will have more than just a passing interest in the city. She has been contracted by the City of Kings Mountain to identify historical and architecturally significant structures.

Ms. Perrin, an architectural historian was hired under a grant from the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resorces Division of Archives and History. She will be working in Kings Mountain to identify significant properties and make recommendations for their preservation and potential use.

A native of Greenville S.C., she

received an A.B. in History from Salem College in Winston-Salem, and her M.A. in History with emphasis in Historic Preservation from Wake Forrest University in Winston-Salem. Her professional memberships include National Trust for Historical Preservation, Preservation Society of N.C., S.C. Historical Society and Charleston, S.C. Library Society.

Last summer Ms. Perrin did a similar study for the City of Reid-

be looking at every structure in Kings Mountain - not just the big, fine old homes found here, but also commercial and industrial structures, churches, schools and even groups of mill houses.

'Sometimes a structure is not significant individually," Ms. Perrin explained. "But in groups, such as inventory is complete, priority

the groups of mill houses here, they may be unique."

When Ms. Perrin finds a structure or a group of buildings significant either historically, culturally or architecturally, she will note a brief description and take photographs of it for her records. After the initial inventory is complete, she will go back to particularly significant sites for more in-depth research and documentation. Later she will make an assessment of her finding.s

The assessment will include in-According to Ms. Perrin, whe will formation on what additional research will be needed and which properties will receive further attention. Based on these findings, additional archival and field research will be conducted and the location of all the properties will be mapped on local planning maps.

When the final assessment of the

rating on the relative significance of the property inventoried, recommendations as to individual properties or areas which should be further researched for national register nominations and recommendations concerning future preservation planning in the com-

munity will be made. Throughout the process of the inventory, community education will be conducted to make Kings Mountain residents aware of the program, its purposes and its fin-

Ms. Perrin said she is hopeful area citizens will take an interest in the project. She pointed out many people are not aware of the numerous historically significant

buildings in Kings Mountain. While Ms. Perrin is identifying structures in town, she will also be talking with area citizens about Kings Mountain and it's history. She will be eager to talk with anyone who has information on the City's historic significance and can be reached through the office of Community Development, City Hall, Kings Mountain, 739-9331.

Arnold Gordon-Wright of the Community Development Office is looking for volunteers to drve around town with Ms. Perrin. "We prefer to have those people who either have a knowledge of Kings Mountain and its history or who have a keen interet in historical preservation," said Mr. Gordon-Wright. "This would be an excellent project for some of the organizations in the community. It will give them an opportunity to learn first-hand of the historic significance of homes and other buildings as well as being an essential part of the neighborhood evaluations."
