Lavar Curry stole home in the top of the sixth inning to give C&C its victory over Kiwanis. Curry also

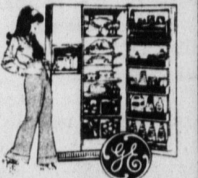
led the winners at bat with 2-for-3, including a homer.

Jamerson hurled the win and Kent Boheler took the loss. Boheler also went 3-for-3 at the plate.



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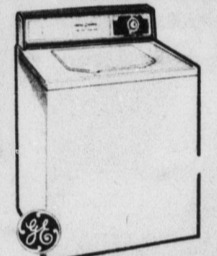


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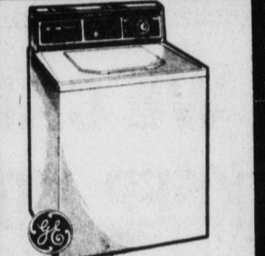
