He is survived by one sister, Leola Oates of Kings Mountain.

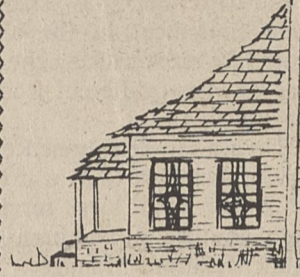
