Penley's Chapel Church of Kings Mountain has scheduled special Easter services.



# **How To Raise A Crook**

The **Presbyterian Journal** contained the following instructions on "How to Raise A Crook."

1 - Begin from infancy to give the child everything he wants. This way he will grow up to believe that the world owes him a living.

2 - When he picks up bad words, laugh at him. It will encourage him to pick up "cuter" phrases that will blow the top off your head later.

3 - Never give him any spiritual training. Wait until he is 21 and then let him decide for himself.

4 - Avoid the use of the word "wrong." It may develop a guilt complex. This will condition him to believe later when he is arrested for stealing a car that society is against him and he is being persecuted.

5 - Pick up anything he leaves lying around-books, shoes, etc. Do everything for him so he will

be experienced in throwing the responsibility onto others.

6 - Let him read any printed matter he can get his hands on. Be careful that the silverware is sterilized, but let his mind feed on garbage.

7 - Take his part against the neighbors, teachers, and policemen. They are all prejudiced against your child.
