Kings Mountain fell to Gastonia, 3-2 in the championship game on Sat., July 9. Gastonia scored two runs in the sixth inning and one in the

seventh after Kings Mountain had gone ahead 2-0 with single runs in the first and second.

Back-to-back doubles by Brent Bagwell and Monty Deaton gave the KM all-stars a 1-0 lead in the first. Patrick Mauney singled and later scored on a single by Scott Wells to make it 2-0 in the

Kings Mountain made it to the finals by defeating South Point 7-6 earlier that same day. Mark Wyte came on in relief of Scott Wells in the third and picked up the win. It was a night of "splits" in mixed league bowling action Tuesday night at the Dilling Heating Lanes.


John Dilling's team split its four-game set with R.W. Hullender and Johnny Dye's team split its four games with Betty Hullender.
