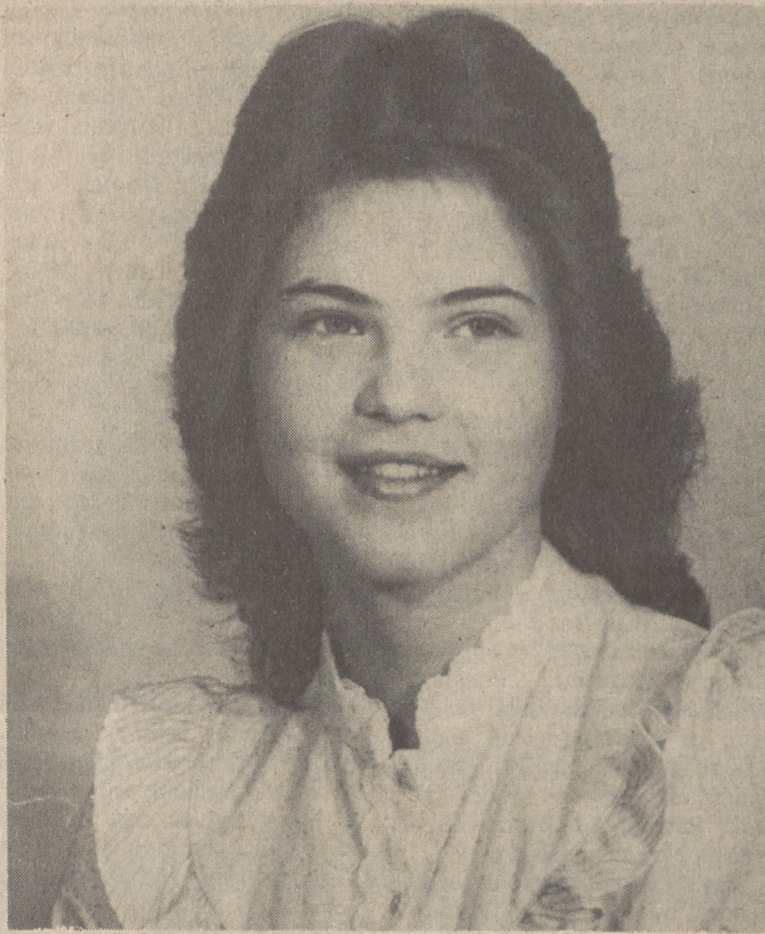
Miss Cheryl Barbee served as guest registrar for the wedding and reception.
