### Dr. Bob Jones To Speak

Dr. Bob Jones, III, president of Bob Jones University in Greenville, S.C., will speak at Carson Memorial Baptist Church on Aug. 30th at 11 a.m.

Dr. Jones is the third president of the University founded by his later grandfather in 1927. Under the leadership of the three Drs. Jones, it has grown from a small college with about 100 students to the largest independent fundamental Christian institution in the world. Now, the university annually enrolls thousands of students from

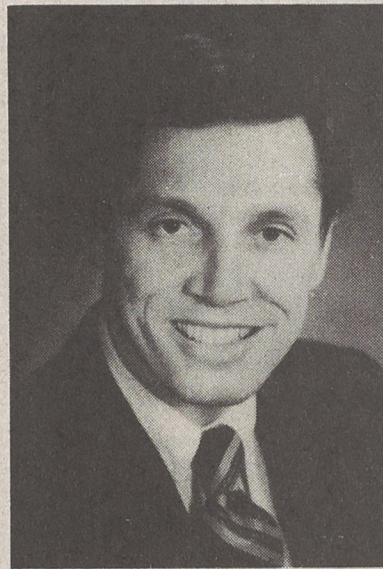
throughout the nation and about 40 foreign countries and territories. Dr. Jones became president of BJU in 1971.

Like his father and grandfather, but with his own distinctive style, Dr. Jones is a forthright, forceful preacher of the Word of God. More requests for meetings come in than the able fundamentalist minister is able to fill with his heavy and varied schedule of duties.

In addition to preaching to all parts of the world, he has conducted tours to the Holy

Land and Europe. He has acted the lead roles in many Shakespearean plays produced by the BJU Classic Players, and has had major parts in several Unusual Films productions, among them full-length, award-winning Christian film, "Wine of Morning", "Red Runs the River", and "Flame in the Wind."

Well known for his outspoken religious and ethical convictions, Dr. Jones was selected to represent nationally the view of fundamentalist Christians on educational television.
