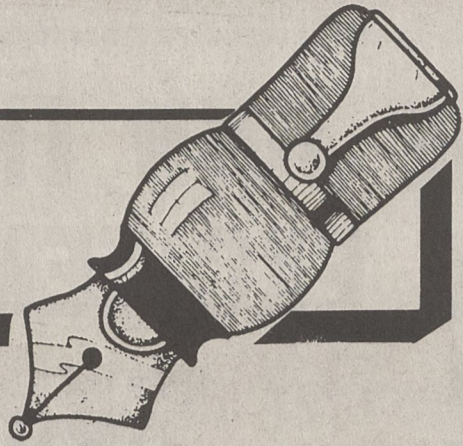

Vote Tuesday

Kings Mountain citizens will go to the polls Tuesday to elect a Mayor and three members of the city council.

The Herald has a long standing policy of not endorsing candidates on the local level. We won't break that policy this year.

However, Tuesday's election is probably more important to Kings Mountain citizens than any other election in recent memory. The new administration still set the policy for a brand new city manager-city council form of government and when citizens go to the polls next week they will be electing a new Mayor for the first time since John Henry Moss was elected Mayor 22 years ago. The addition of two incumbent commissioners in the mayor's race will be on the six-member board.

The three people on the city board to be elected Tuesday will have half the voting power on the board of commissioners. They should be elected by a majority—not a minority, of the voters. The new Mayor should be elected by a majority—not a minority—of the voters.

There are important decisions to be made and important programs to be carried out that will touch every citizen of Kings Mountain. Chances are those decisions will not satisfy every citizen. And, chances are the most dissatisfied will be the very ones who stay at home. Go to the polls Tuesday and vote.

and town. They give of their time and labor, at times risking their lives for others.

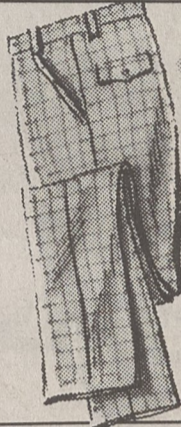
Please everyone help support these faithful volunteers and help keep their equipment up to date. You may need them someday also.
