INEVITABLENESS OF OUR CHRIST'S RESURRECTION

Text, Acts 2:24. "Whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death because it was not. possible that he should not be holden of it."

"This is the language of the first Christian apostle in the first. sermon that was ever preached in the church of Christ. In it St. Peter argues that Jesus had really ascended into heaven, because he had first really risen from his grave. Listen to what the apostle ays about a subject upon which opportunities, to say nothing of his higher credentials qualified him to speak

1. St. Peter states the fact of Corist's resurrection. "Whom Christ hath raised up." Remember ne was preaching in Jerusalem, and to some who had taken part in the crucifixion. It was then to persons keenly interested in the subject and who could test the ex-act truth of what he said that Peter stated unhesitatingly the fact of the resurrection.

11. The reason by gives for the resurrection, "Because it was not possible that he should be holden of it," and his grounds for saying it is a divine impossibility, are: Jewish prophecy forbade the Christ to remain in the grave. "For David speaketh concerning him." The Jews believed in the reality and in the compulsive force of prophecy, and so as to the prin-ciple of argument, there would have been no controversy.

2. The character of Jesus. The leading feature of our Savior's character was its simple truthfulness, and he had said that again and again that after dying he would rise. Sometimes he used a metaphor to express his mean-ing and sometimes he alluded to Hebrew history. For instance, Jonah, as a parallel, and to the disciples he thrice says plainly that he shall rise again.

3. He was the "Prince of Life." How could the very Lord and source of life be subdued by death if for reasons of wisdom and mercy he subjected the nature which he was made his own, to the king of terrors, it was not in the course of nature that he should be held in the grave when his object was achieved.
