

No Accidents On Weekend Of Fourth

The Independence Day weekend was observed quietly in Kings Mountain. No automobile accidents occurred in the city during the Fourth of July weekend. Kings Mountain Police Department

were called to the scene of three accidents on Thursday, July 1, and to one accident on Monday, July 5th. Glenn Joseph Suttles, 1420 Second St. Ext., was treated for injuries at Kings Mountain

Hospital and released Monday morning after an 11:05 a. m. two-car crash involving the Suttles 1972 Datsun and a 1966 International Truck operated by Robert S. Moss, R-2 Catawba, on Cleveland Ave.

According to Ptl. Mike Moss, who investigated for KMPD, Moss was traveling S. on Cleveland couldn't get stopped for the red light and hit the Suttles car going through the intersection of Cleveland and Linwood Rd. Damages were estimated at \$2,000 to the Suttles car and \$200 to the truck.

A "rear end" collision occurred Thursday at 11:35 p. m. when a car operated by Lake Thomas Bolin, Rt. 2, Blacksburg, S. C., reportedly struck the back of a 1969 Ford operated by Robert F. Ware, Rt. 1, on Waco Rd. Damages were estimated at \$500 to the Bolin 1966 Ford and \$250 to the Ware vehicle, according to Ptl. Harry Martin who investigated.

Howser Home Preserved

Mivetti Construction Co. of Charlotte has been awarded a \$64,027.50 contract by the U. S. Department of Interior for the preservation of the Henry Howser home in Kings Mountain National Military Park.

The two-story dwelling is one of the few surviving stone structures from the 19th century in the south. Work is scheduled to begin immediately with nine months in which to finish.

The main portion of the house was built in 1803 by Henry Howser, who worked as a stonemason. The materials he used were gathered from rock quarries in the Kings Mountain area.

The Howser home consists of three rooms downstairs and one large, open room upstairs. There is a cellar also. The money being spent on the restoration, according to Jack Garner, an historic architect with the National Park Service out of Atlanta, is to keep the dwelling from further deterioration.

Restoration includes resetting loose stones around the fireplace, replacing the roof and decayed interior on the first floor and maintenance of grounds around the structure.

Howser, whose name and the date of the construction are carved in stone above the main entrance of the house, is also listed as a distiller, according to Dan Gold, a KM National Military Park ranger.

The dwelling will be closed to tourists during the restoration work.
