Monthly GED Tests

The monthly GED examination is scheduled at Cleveland Tech on Fri., July 20, from 1-6 p.m. and will continue Sat. July 21, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m.

Both sessions are required in order to complete the test. Application may be made by any North Carolina adult 18 or older who has been out of a

regular high school program for at least six months.

The examination tests knowledge and understanding of correct English, social studies, natural science, literature, and mathematics. Upon successful completing of the examination, the adult will be issued a Certificate of High School Equivalency by the NC State Board of Education.

A new state regulation established a \$5 fee for the GED testing service. This fee will be collected by Cleveland Tech's business office at 12:30 p.m., on July 20. The receipt along with proper identification will serve as admittance to the testing session.

Applications to be tested or re-tested must be made by Fri., July 13 to Mrs. Rebecca Cook or a staff member in the Learning Resources Center at Cleveland Tech, 137 S. Post Rd., Shelby.
