sformed into an ass and has the fairy queen fall in love with him; the marriage of Theseus, Duke of Athens, and Hippolyta, Queen of the Amazons; a hilarious rollicking play performed by a group of peasants for the wedding reception; and a jealous intrigue between the king and queen of the fairies.
