Research Client Identification - To develop an active process of client ID and to selectively identify potential firms which might be attracted to the area.

Development Team - To be composed of local citizens who are knowledgeable about such topics as transportation, utilities, government services, taxes, labor resources, industrial sites and buildings, liveability and other factors that are important to a client's selection of a com-

Existing Industry - To visit each industry and major business to get existing industries awareness and support of the community's effort to promote economic development, and to offer assistance to problems encountered by existing industry and business.

Downtown Revitalization -To work with the community officials to upgrade and/or stabilize the economic and social vitality of the downtown area, and prepare a study of downtown and establish short and longterm goals and objectives for initiating the downtown program.

Community Journal - To prepare a scrapbook documenting the efforts in achieving goals and to present to state officials munity will be inspected by state officials.

The Development Team subcommittees, and their responsibilities, include:

Liveability - Responsible for recreation, to identify potential tourist attractions and establish a clean-up, fix-up campaign.

Finance - Responsible for developing the already-formed Kings Mountain Development Corporation, that has the ability to finance the construction of industrial buildings that can be leased or sold to industrial clients and that can option, purchase and sell property. Officers of the corporation include Mayor Moss, president; Josh Hinnant, vice president; King, secretary; and Tom Tate, treasurer. The bard of directors includes Mayor Moss, Mickey Corry, Charles Hamilton, Ollie Harris, Ruby Baker, Jackie White, George Thomasson, Tom Tate, Larry Hamrick, Darrell Austin, Josh Hinnant and King.

Community planning - To organize a planning board with up-to-date appointments, and formulate a develoment plan which gives indication of where the community wants to go in the future, adopt and implement the development plan and seek citizen participation in the formulation and implementation of the plan.

Government and taxes Responsible for being familiar with the form of local and county government, and with the prevailing tax structures of each. and be able to discuss tax policies as well as rates and assessment

manufacturer's inventories, etc.

Labor availability - Responsible for keeping abreast of the available labor statistics, familiar with industrial training facilities in the area, be able to furnish wage rate information or various job classifications and become familiar with fringe benefit practices, etc.

Industrial sites/buildings -Compile complete information on all available industrial sites, and know location, size, price, and ownership of each site; plus, compile plats, topographic maps and aerial photos, and know what services are or can be available at each site.

Utilities - Be able to identify the sources of water supply, sewage services, natural gas,

electrical service and telephone services, and give information on volumes and capacities, etc.

Community profile - Compile a profile to be submitted to the State Department of Commerce, to include such things as locations, population, labor, taxes, utilities and service, government, education, etc.

Transportation - Responsible for compiling information about available transportation, rates, delivery schedules, distances,

Education and training - Be up-to-date on the educational system for the general public, plus compile information concerning education and training programs offered by local colleges and technical institutions to accommodate new employees.
