A conservation fair booth was sponsored by the District at the Bethware Community Fair which is usually held about mid-September each year. The District also sponsored a conservation booth at the Cleveland County Fair which is usually held the later part of September and first of October. The District Board provides conservation booklets for all 6th grade students and teacher's guides for their teachers for all Cleveland County, Kings Mountain City, Shelby City and Twelve Oaks Academy schools.

## **Issues Statement**

## On Draft

Rick Pasotto, Libertarian candidate for the U.S. Senate in the November general election, issued this statement on the draft Wednesday.

Said the Charlotte buyer for industrial textile supplies, "The draft is slavery. It is nothing more than a prelude to conscription. It is involuntary servitude. It has no place in American society. Registration is a major step toward the Vietnam era treatment of America's youth as cannon fodder.'

David Braatz, secretary to the candidate, said that the Libertarian national committee on Feb. 3 approved resolution opposing any form of compulsory registration for the draft and endorsing civil disobedience as an appropriate moral and practical means of resisting mandatory registration and the draft.

Pasotto faces Democratic opposition from incumbent Robert Morgan and GOP opposition from John East, neither of whom have indicated they will participate in a debate.
