Mounties Travel To East Gaston Friday

Kings Mountain's Mountaineers will be facing a "hungry" tribe of Warriors Friday night when they travel to Arrowhead Stadium to meet East Gaston.

East Gaston, coached by former KMHS players Jerry Adams and Darrell Van Dyke, is 0-2 and eager to get in the win column in Southwestern 3-A

The Warriors have dropped a pair of close road games, 6-0 in the rain to East Lincoln and 17-14 to defending state champion South Point.

Kings Mountain, which edged the Warriors 6-0 in the rain last year, is 1-1, having lost to Burns 27-8 and beaten Ashbrook 19-0. It's the first game for the War-

riors in their improved stadium and a huge home following is expected to attend the first home

Coach Dan Brooks of the Mountaineers feels his club will have to give a similar perfor-mance to last week's if it is to be successful against the Warriors.

"They look real good," says the third-year Mountie mentor.

"They're quick and strong and could very easily be 2-0 instead of 0-2. They were deep in East Lincoln territory and close to scoring a couple of weeks ago, and lost a fumble, and last week against South Point they were leading 14-10 with time running out and fumbled, and South Point took it all the way for a touchdown and the win.'

East Gaston has a veteran ballclub. The Warriors have 35 lettermen back from last year's


