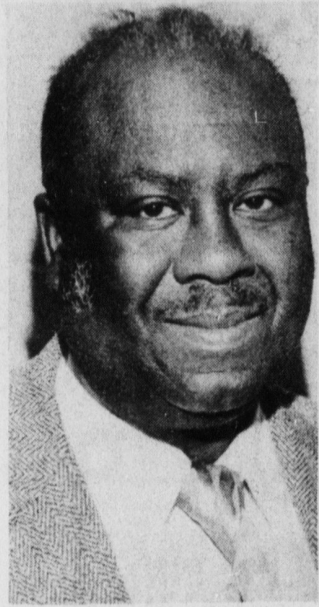


OBITUARIES

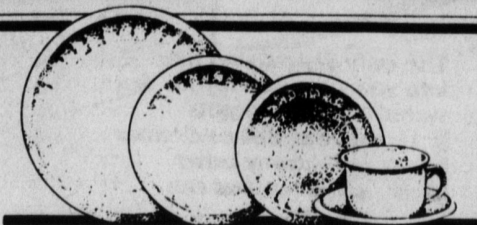
