Col. Painter Retires

Col. Charles E. Painter, Deputy for Engineering and Evaluation for the Air Force Acquisi-Logistics Division tion (AFALD), has retired from active duty in the Air Force. In ceremonies at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio Wednesday (Oct. 29), Colonel Painter's 26-year military career ended.

Colonel Painter was born in Kings Mountain, on February 17, 1934. He graduated from Kings Mountain High School in 1952 and received his commission in 1954.

His first assignment was as a B-47 combat crew navigator-bombadier at Mountain Home AFB, Idaho. Other assignments in the navigator and navigatorbombadier fields took him to McConnell AFB, Kan., and Bergstrom AFB, Texas.

In 1966, Colonel Painter entered the Air Force Institute of Technology here at Wright-Patterson, graduating in 1969 with bachelor's and master's degrees in aerospace mechanical engineering.

He served with the 14th Special Operations Wing in Vietnam from April 1970 until April 1971, when he returned to Wright-Patterson as a propulsion engineer in the Aeronautical Systems Division.

In August 1977, Colonel Painter was assigned to the Oklahoma City air Logistics Center at Tinker AFB, Okla. He was chief of the Engineering Division of the Directorate of Material Management and later became chief of the Propulsion

Management Division. From September 1, 1979 until his retirement, Colonel Painter was Deputy for Engineering and Evaluation for AFALD. His organization's mission is to improve the flow and use of information on technical design and performance capabilities of weapon systems.

The deputate is vitally important to the overall mission of AFALD, which strives to hold down the costs of acquiring new weapon systems while ensuring that new systems are highly reliable and can be affordably maintained during the lifetime of the system.

Colonel Painter is a Master Navigator with 4200 hours of flying time. His military decorations include the Legion of Merit


