

Graveyard Is Memorial

The Old Hullender Graveyard on Cherryville Rd. is a memorial to Christopher and Rebeca Kiser Hullender, born in 1812, who buried two of their children there because there was no burial ground near their log house.

Two of the Hullender's four daughters were buried above the house on the side of the road. The children were Lynda (Mrs. Levi) Huffstetler, Louise (Mrs. Glenn) Morrow, Liza (Mrs. Daniel) Carpenter and Mary Ann (Mrs. Isaac) Forster.

Because of the interest of the old cemetery over the years, Mrs. Lizzie Rohm Talbert, of Route 3, Clover, S.C., has related some of the history of the cemetery. Mary Ann Forster was Mrs. Talbert's grandmother.

Mrs. Talbert recalls visiting her grandmother in the old house, a log two-story structure with large fireplace on one end. There was an iron hearth with four slabs about eight inches wide and six feet long. The stairway was also in the front room. There was a door on each side, two windows on each side, and a back porch with a porch room. The kitchen, which was off from the main house, had a large fireplace where the family cooked their meals. The family handwove their clothes on a loom and spinning wheel. There were two corn cribs, with a driveway between for the wagons, a wheat house and a log barn.

Mrs. Talbert recalled the stories her grandmother used to tell of how the family celebrated Christmas.

"They had a large bake oven and they started their Christmas baking the week before Christmas," said Mrs. Talbert. "At Christmas time they would put large logs on the fire and set the table with all kinds of food. A large pot of coffee, ginger stew

and corn whiskey would be on the table. Long pine torches would be lighted and the families would visit from house to house in the neighborhood eating and drinking all night. The homes were miles apart then, but the distance didn't matter," she added.

"New Year's Day would find the menfolk going New Year's shooting. I can remember a

chant I heard my father repeat. It went like this "Here I stand in your yard, Guns and pistols in hand, At your desire we all fire at your command."

Families also kept what was called Old Christmas, 12 days from Christmas. They would go to the barn to hear "the cows low at midnight." Mrs. Talbert said she never did participate in the midnight ritual.

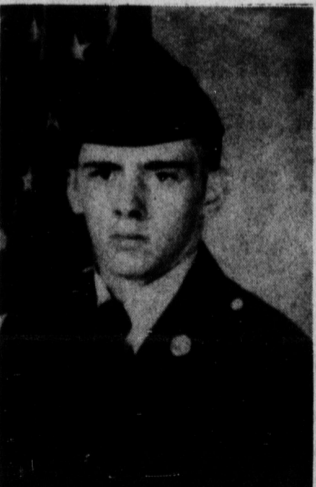
