KM High will open its bid for the state 3-A baseball championship in a best of three series tonight at Greene Central High in Snow Hill.

KM District Schools will probably hold the line in its anticipated budget but will receive \$5,155 less from the county commissioners than the unit requested for its 1980-81 budget.

Grover Town Council voted 3-2 not to give employees raises this year but changed their minds later in executive session and rescinded the action 3-2 for more discussion this Thursday night.

The second administration of the competency test for teacher aides for the KM District will be held July 3 at KMSHS.

A Free Kids dog show, a fireworks extravaganza, open air flea market and all day events are planned at the KM Community Center and Deal St. Complex during the annual July 4th celebration in the city.

A large segment of KM industry will be closed for the week of July 4th and most of them with pay, a survey of industry reveals.
