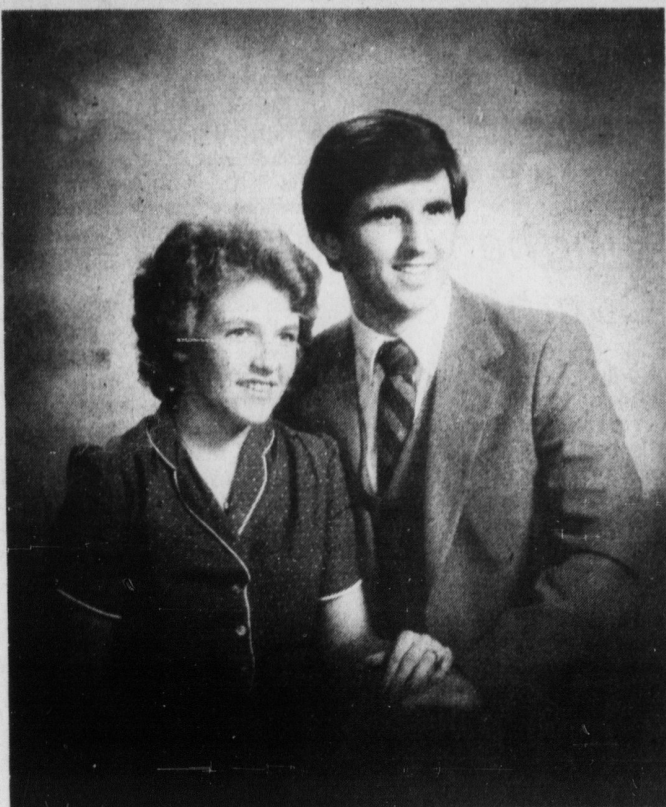


Open House will be held at Kings Mountain High School Tuesday at 7:30. The KMHS chorus will present a program in the auditorium. Parents and friends of the school are invited.

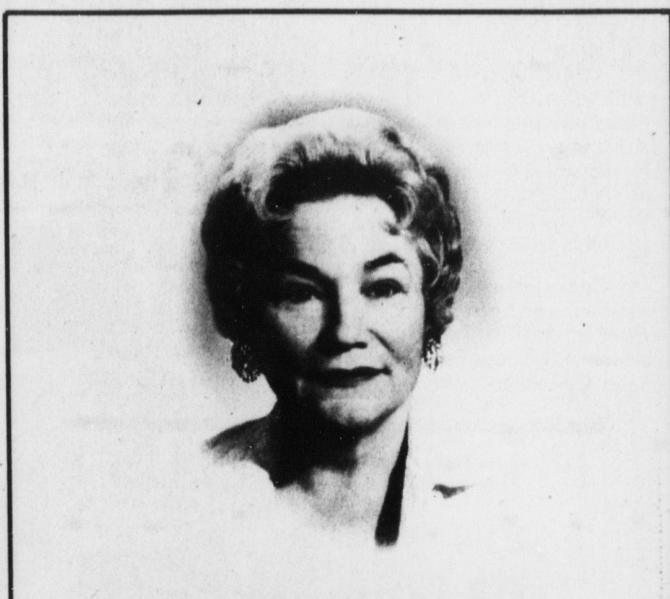
Auxiliary To Meet Tonight
