children and their children had come to this end: 13 college presidents, 65 professors, 100 lawyers, a dean of out-standing law school, 30 judges, 56 physicians, a dean of medical school, 80 office holders including 3 U.S. senators, 3 mayors of large U.S. cities, 3 governors of states, a vice president of the U.S., a comptroller of the U.S. Treasury, 100 overseas missionaries, and platoons of clergymen. School Advisory Councils, required by Title I, Exceptional Childrens Program etc., Blue Ribbon Committee, appointed to study present conditions and make recommendations and priorities for the future.

In this school system we do want open communication and parent involvement.
