Kay Holshouser of the County Unit came to the school on Monday of last week to kick-off the drive. She showed the film "John Baker's Last Race", about a coach who dies of cancer, and it inspired the students.

For the remainder of the week, Danna and Janet spent most of their time after school—and all of their spare time during school—making links and counting money. There were contests among the classrooms, with the winners getting a free meal at McDonald's and the winning room receiving a plaque on Awards Day.

The coordinators feel the success was due to the "personal experience" students have had with cancer. "A lot of students," Janet pointed out, "have experienced cancer in their family and we have a lot of students here at school who have it."

Janet recently lost her mother to the disease.

"The response was unbelievable," said Danna. "We never thought we'd get this much."

While many of the students made chain links and counted donations from that project, many boys wearing bermuda shorts walked the halls and let students admire their pretty legs for a donation.
