

Militant Press Essential For Freedom, Walker Says

DURHAM — William O. Walker, president of the National Publishers' Association, told a Press Week observance at North Carolina College Monday. "No racial group of people any where in the world since the development of newspapers have attained their freedom or improved their status without the aid of their own militant press."

Walker spoke at NCC commemorating the 152nd anniversary of Freedom's Journal, first U. S. newspaper published by Negroes. He is publisher of the Call and Post of Cleveland, Ohio.

"The Negro press can make the adjustment in this transition to integration by continuing to voice the aspirations of our people and, at the same time, providing them with a superior product in an open competitive market," the noted publisher said. Today's editors have

a glorious crusading heritage from Samuel Rumsford which must be maintained, Walker said.

At a special luncheon in his honor, Walker, a former City Commissioner in Cleveland, said "Ballot and judicious use of our spending power" can change the status of the great mass of minorities. NCC President Alfonso Elder, Durham City Commissioner J. B. Stewart, and B. N. Harris, member of the Durham City Board of Education, were among luncheon guests.

Walker credited the Negro press with many of the Negro's civil rights gains and he lashed out at hostile critics of the Negro press.

"To the so-called Negro intelligentsia who find all manner of fault with Negro newspapers, I direct this question: Where would you be if there were no Negro press. No groups have profited more from the crusading of the Negro press than our white collar and professional groups.

Walker added: "As to our policies, the Negro press recognizes that the Negro is no taller in America than he can reach in Mississippi. Our freedom must not be measured in Ohio, but in South Carolina. The level of justice is not what it is in Illinois, but what the stage shows in Georgia. Our education must be evaluated by Alabama standards and not those of Pennsylvania."

"The Negro press is our outpost of thought and action. Only the full support of our own people can keep us in this position.

"People who don't read — and this includes newspapers — are not well informed, and people who are not well informed, are a backward and exploited people.

Freedom for minorities and subjugated peoples always come high. If the Negro thinks he can purchase his freedom from segregation and poverty in America at a bargain, cut-rate price, he is going to be sadly mistaken.

Sayles, head of the science division at the college, will direct a six-week program from June 22 to July 21 for 1959 high school graduates and 11th and 12th grade students to high ability and special talent in the sciences and mathematics.

Because enrollment must necessarily be limited, interested students should make early application by writing to Dr. J. Henry Sayles, Director, Summer Science Training Program, Bennett College, Greensboro.

The general objective of the program is to provide high quality instruction in the biological and physical sciences and in mathematics through a program of basic courses in biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics, tutorial conferences, informal discussion and seminars.

Classroom teaching will be supplemented by field trips, visits to the Morehead Planetarium in Chapel Hill, the nuclear reactor of N. C. State College in Raleigh, the area weather bureau and observation of the work in nearby industrial research laboratories, granted travel expenses, room.

Each student accepted will be necessary materials and supplies.
