Human Relations Institute Opens April 6 At Smith U.

CHARLOTTE — An Institute on Human Relations and Intergroup Understanding has been scheduled for April 6 and 7, at Johnson C. Smith University, according to an announcement made by Dr. Rufus S. Perry, recently rector of the Presbyterian Foundation; Claude U. Branch, pastor St. John's Baptist Church, Charlotte; J. B. Humphrey, pastor, First Baptist (Church Street), Charlotte; and I. Howard Chadwick, pastor, Westminster Presbyterian Church, Charlotte.

Persons interested in attending the institute are asked to write Dr. R. P. Perry immediately for registration forms. A Union Community Service, to which the public is invited, will be held on Monday night, April 6, at 8:30 o'clock. Dr. Perry, president of the university, has given the following as its purpose: "The Institute is designed to provide careful and critical investigation for the purpose of clearing away misconceptions, separating fact from fiction, and bringing out in broad perspective what is required and what most needs to be studied for better human relations."

The Institute is one of the first of its kind to be held in this area. Dr. Frank P. Graham, former president of the University of North Carolina and Special Ambassador of the United Nations, will be one of the speakers at the Institute. Addresser will also be delivered by: Dr. Linton Pope, Dean of the Yale Divinity School; John C. Bennett, Dean of the Faculty, Union Theological Seminary, New York City; William Brewer, Editor, "The Journal of Negro History"; Will D. Campbell, Associate Executive, National Council of Churches; Anna Hedgeman, former Assistant to the Mayor of New York City; Maxwell C. Hill, Professor, Columbia University; Oscar Lee, Executive Director, Department of Racial and Cultural Relations, National Council of Churches; A. O. Steele, Professor, Johnson C. Smith University; Marion A. Wright, noted lawyer and citizen, Linville Falls, N. C.; and Herman L. Turner, Pastor, Covenant Presbyterian Church, Atlanta, Ga.

Faubus Halts Ferry Name For Ashmore

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (ANP) — Gov. Faubus last Wednesday turned down a legislative resolution which asked that the name of the Ashmore Landing after Harry S. Ashmore, the Pulitzer-Prize winning executive editor of the Arkansas Gazette.

"Ashmore has been a persistent critic of Faubus' resistance to school integration. In writing in a veto message, Faubus referred to Ashmore as "the greatest renegade since Powell Clayton." Clayton was a "carpetbagger" governor and U. S. senator following the Civil War. Faubus drew the parallel saying, "In my judgment, many people of the state would consider the renaming of the ferry as an act that would defame a well-known leader by naming it for a man regarded by many as the state's greatest renegade since Powell Clayton."

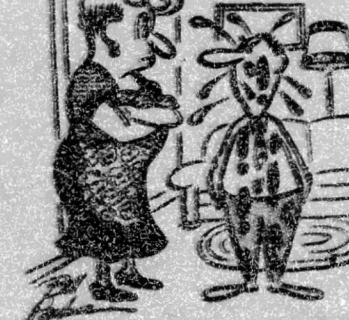
