and Roman Spectra of Some Alkylstannanes."

FINGERPRINTING MOLECULES
In lay language, the researchers are "fingerprinting" molecules. They are observing how light affects the character of certain molecules and the atoms of which they are made. Through this study, they hope to learn more about the chemical bonds that hold some molecules together.

Their findings may be of benefit to the petroleum industry. Dr. Dillard explains that infrared spectroscopy is an important tool in petroleum research, and because of this, the study may shed light on contributions of specific alkyl radicals to the infrared spectra of complex hydrocarbon molecules.

TEN HOURS A WEEK
Each of the student researchers puts in ten hours a week in the laboratory. Here the students learn how to prepare compounds of carbon hydrogen and tin. They also are getting experience in analyzing data.

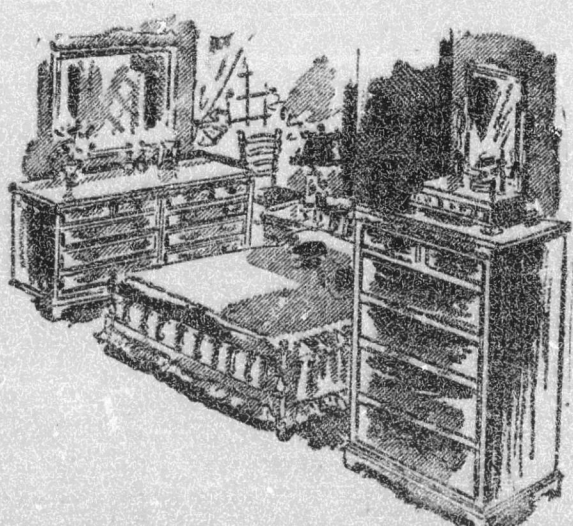
