

# Big Elks Suit Finally Settled "For Good Of Order"

## Case Once Threatened To "Blow Lid Off Elkdom"

NEWARK, N. J. — (ANP)—The suit by five Jersey Elk leaders, which once threatened to blow the lid off Elkdom, was quietly settled last week in Judge Everett Sherer's Superior Court in the city-county building, following a day's testimony by plaintiffs.

Each of the plaintiffs—John A. Whittaker, Newark, John N. Jones, Linden; William Royster, East Orange; Louis C. Spicer, East Orange, and W. Hollis Plinton, Westfield—was asked by the judge if he agreed to the withdrawal, and each replied in the affirmative.

The court congratulated the grand lodge and the plaintiffs for being able to settle the matter without long, drawn-out litigation.

Perry W. Howard, grand lodge counsel, and Robert S. Hartgrove, Jersey City counsel for the plaintiffs, said in a joint statement:

"The parties agreed to the settlement after several conferences. It is for the good of the Order and now the plaintiffs and defendants are as one."

With Grand Exalted Ruler Robert Johnson III in Philadelphia, the grand lodge was represented by Atty. Howard; Paul M. Salsburg, Atlantic City, assistant counsel.

Robert Ellis, Washington, D. C., assistant counsel; Hobson Reynolds, Philadelphia; Judge W. C. Hueston and John T. Freeman, Washington, D. C.; Dr. L. W. Williams, Valdosta, Ga.; Charles P. McClane, Steelton, Pa., and George W. Lee, Memphis.

The court hearing was in a small room and drew no crowd, save Elk leaders, James H. Fultz, Newark, a trustee though also linked with the plaintiffs; William Royster, state recording secretary and Atty. Howard, were called to the stand by plaintiffs.

The first two testified regarding general operation of the Order and Royster testified to reasons for the suit and why the plaintiffs considered it an action on behalf of all 100,000 Elk members. There were frequent clashes between Hartgrove and Salsburg.

The plaintiffs' auditor, Harold Parker, Newark, testified to his audit of grand lodge books on the first day. Most of the night, both sides were together in conference, with rumors of settlement flying.

The rumors proved true the next morning. The lawyers were called into the judge's chambers, and the official announcement of the agreement was made later by the judge.

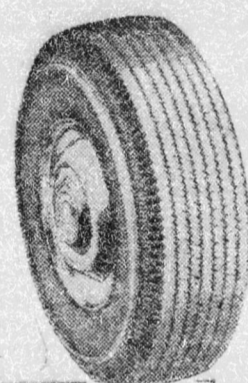

LITTLE ROCK (ANP) — Bail was denied two white men charged with raping a 21-year-old Negro beauty last week near Benton, Ark. Prosecutor Lawson E. Glover said the girl did not consent to the men's advances and that force had been used.

Heft after allegedly admitting they raped the girl are 27-year-old Ben Sanders and Bobby Burnett, 21.

The rape victim who had all of her front teeth knocked out, said the attack occurred when the men lured her away from her home on the pretext of wanting a babysitter because their wives were having company.

Left bruised and bleeding on a strange highway, she was picked up by a white woman who rushed her to her house for clean clothes. They were met by a sheriff's car who transferred the girl to his car.

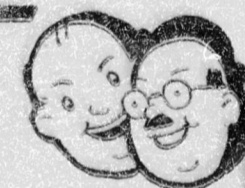
