

4-Day TB Institute Is Planned In State

LAKE JUNALUSKA — The 8th Institute on Problems in Tuberculosis Control sponsored by eight North Carolina Agencies will be held at the Methodist Assembly here June 28 through July 1. Over 100 health, welfare, rehabilitation and TB workers from Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Virginia, West Virginia and Maryland are expected to attend.

The institute gives its participants an opportunity to learn the latest trends in TB control and ways of working together for the benefit of the TB patient. This year's program will answer the question, "Who are the people who develop tuberculosis?" and follow through with discussions on problems and practices of hospital care, understanding the patient and his problems, and coordination of patient services in and out of the hospital.

Noted authorities who will contribute their ideas on the various topics include a psychiatrist from the University of North Carolina, Dr. Myron Sandifer; and a psychologist from Vanderbilt University, Dr. Shalom E. Vineberg. Others are Dr. Raymond F. Corpe, superintendent of a TB hospital in Georgia; Dr. John Cassell, an epidemiologist from the University of North Carolina; and Miss Myrtle Dooley, Assistant director of nurses for the Baltimore City Hospital.

The sponsors are the N. C. Tuberculosis Association, Schools of Public Health, Social Work and Medicine of the University of North Carolina, N. C. State Board of Health and Public Welfare.

Anti-Bias Agency Handles Heavier Case Load Than During Year Of '58

NEW YORK, N. Y. (ANP) — During the first three months of 1959, according to the State Commission Against Discrimination (SCAD), the anti-bias state agency received 242 complaints charging bias.

The complaints represented a 43 percent increase over the same period during 1958. The volume of complaints also indicated the second largest first quarter in SCAD's 14-year history.

Discrimination based upon color, as in the past, was the primary source of complaints, accounting for roughly 60 percent of the complaints filed during the three-month period.

More than in any other period the complaints were largely filed against employment agencies and managerial, sales and clerical positions.

As of March 31, 1959, 727. The majority of "offenders" in the employment discrimination cases were in manufacturing, 55, to be exact. Following as respondents in such discrimination cases were retail trade businesses, 33; employment agencies, 22; labor unions, 22; government agencies, 11; and restaurants, 10.

In other areas of SCAD's jurisdiction, places of public accommodations and publicly-assisted housing, the agency received 15 complaints in each category. In those instances the case load was below that of the same 1958 period.

NCC Appoints Chairman For Language Dept.

DURHAM — Dr. Albert H. Berrian, Director of Foreign Language at Texas Southern University, has been named head of the Romance Languages Department at North Carolina College.

He succeeds Dr. John H. Morrow, Ambassador designate to the Republic of Guinea, Dr. Berrian, 35, a native of Miami, Fla., received the Ph.D. degree in 1954 from New York University. He is married and the father of 3 children.

The new NCC department head also received the B. A. and M. A. degrees at New York University, specializing in French and English literature.

During the summer of 1957 he studied at the University of Paris.

Dr. Berrian's teaching career began in 1949 at Clark College, Atlanta, Ga. From 1952 to 1954, he taught languages in the Accredited Evening High School in Jersey City, New Jersey.

He was professor of German at Southern University, Baton Rouge, La., during 1954-1956.

From 1956 to 1958 Professor Berrian headed the foreign language department at Central State College, Wilberforce, Ohio.

He was visiting professor of languages at Atlanta University in the summer of 1951.

In the Summer of 1954 he was guest scholar at the University of Laval in France.

Dr. Berrian was named director of foreign language at Texas Southern University in September, 1958.

Employment Agencies Hit As Offenders

NEW YORK — The New York Council of the American Jewish Congress charged Monday that employment agencies are among the worst offenders in violating the New York fair employment law.

In a statement, Howard Squadron, chairman of the Commission on Law and Social Action of the local A.J. Congress unit, cited surveys taken by the Congress showing that nearly three out of four Manhattan employment agencies that supply secretarial help are willing to accept job orders that illegally limit employment to white Protestants.
