

## UNCF Distributes June Grants To North Carolina Colleges

NEW YORK—The United Negro College Fund distributed \$49,528 to six member North Carolina colleges and universities this week. This is the second allocation to member colleges in 1959. North Carolina members have now received a total of \$133,779 during the current calendar year.

The North Carolina institutions sharing in the UNCF allocations are: Barber-Scott College, Concord; Bennett College, Greensboro; Johnson C. Smith University, Charlotte; Livingstone College, Salisbury;

St. Augustine's College and Shaw University, Raleigh. Bruce Barton, chairman of the board, Barton, Durstine & Cahoon, advertising agency, and 1959 UNCF national campaign chairman reports the nation-wide fund-raising appeal for the college is running a head of last year. More than 4,200 volunteers

are working in 151 campaign communities coast to coast this year.

The 1959 campaign to raise 10 percent of the annual educational budgets of the 33 UNCF allocations to provide scholarship aid, augment faculty salaries and buy library books and laboratory equipment.

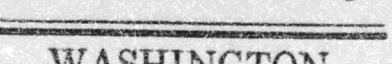
## Dean, Mrs. Foster Payne To Nova Scotia Confab In July

## U. S. Indicts 9 Deputies For Brutality

WASHINGTON, D. C. — (AP) — Atty. Gen. William P. Rogers announced recently the return of 14 indictments by a special Federal grand jury in Dayton, O., charging nine defendants, present and former members of the Montgomery county sheriff's office, including a former lieutenant of detectives, with violations of the federal civil rights laws.

Extensive investigation by the FBI had preceded the department's presentation of the case involving charges of mistreatment of 16 individuals who had been held in custody in the Montgomery county sheriff's office.

The indictments charge violation of section 242 of the federal criminal code, which prohibits the willful deprivation of rights secured or protected by the U. S. Constitution. The maximum penalties under this section are a \$1,000 fine, one year in prison or both.

The specific civil rights violations charged included actual physical brutality imposed for the purpose of extracting confessions and for the purpose of administering summary punishment upon individuals held in custody; unlawful arrest and detention; and permitting an assault on a prisoner

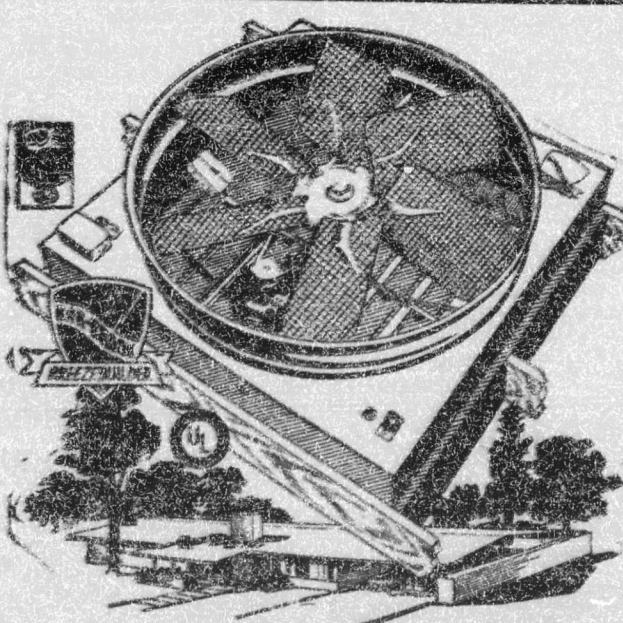
