'More Convinced Than Ever That Non-Violent Resistance Most Potent Weapon:' Dr. King

NEW YORK — "I left India more convinced than ever before that non-violent resistance is the most potent weapon available to oppressed people in their struggle for freedom." The words belong to the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., who writes of "My Trip to the Land of Ghandi," in the July issue of EBONY Magazine.

The man who used Ghandi techniques in leading the successful bus integration battle of Montgomery, Alabama, made the pilgrimage with his wife Coretta and biographer Lawrence Reddick. He found the spirit of Ghandi very much alive in India today and says that Ghandians praised his passive resistance experiment in Montgomery.

"They seemed to look upon it as an outstanding example of the possibilities of its use in western civilization," he says. "To them as to me it also suggests that non-violent resistance when planned and positive in action can work effectively even under totalitarian regimes."

The Rev. King writes in EBONY that because of Ghandi's teachings a mutual friendship based on complete equality exists today between the Indian and British people within the Commonwealth. He feels that the crusade for independence and human dignity that is now reaching a climax in Africa

will have a more positive effect on the world if it were waged along lines that were first demonstrated in the Continent by Ghandi himself.

"The way of acquiescence leads to moral and spiritual suicide," he writes. "The way of violence leads to bitterness in the survivors and brutality in the destroyers."

Rental Restrictions Block Complete Integration

ST. LOUIS — The Missouri Advisory Committee of the Federal Commission on Civil Rights reported recently that 95 per cent of Negro school children in Missouri are attending desegregated schools.

However, the report pointed out that residential segregation has resulted in a large percentage of Negro children attending schools that are, in fact, Negro schools. Some high schools remain as segregated as before the 1954 decision of the United States Supreme Court.

The committee said school integration would "remain a mockery" so long as "free choice in home-buying and renting" was denied.

The Missouri school board made plans for complete integration after the court decision in 1954. The plans were endorsed by the various communities.

Whites' Removal To Slums Predicted

CINCINNATI — Charles Stamm, director of Urban Renewal, in an impromptu speech last week told the Cincinnati Association of Real Estate Brokers "whites will move to slum areas rather than live in integrated public housing."

"I feel within the next ten years

all public housing will be for non-white occupancy," he said.

Mr. Stamm, who was criticized along with the FHA administrator by the Brokers Association for "racially designated housing," added, "If this prediction is not true, you can hang me."

He explained in an interview that in view of "prejudice, conventions and the unwritten rule against integrated housing, we are constantly faced with obstacles."

Diocese Votes Against Bias

DETROIT — The 1959 Convention of the Episcopal Diocese in Michigan voted a resolution withholding Episcopal financial support from any institution or agency which practiced segregation.

Priest Speaks On Racism

PEORIA, Ill. — Fr. William J. Kenealy, S. J., a priest-legal expert, sees racism as "the most critical of all domestic problems facing this country."

The priest said, "I think there is less hypocrisy about race relations in the South. Most Southerners say what they think, and practice what they preach."

"In many areas, especially employment and housing, northern practice is patently

at variance with northern preaching."

"Ironically, the statistics offered in support of segregation constitute powerful evidence against it. Surely it is a cruel and cynical logic which argues for segregation from the very evils it has produced," he concluded.

Fr. Kenealy made these remarks before the Boston College Law Department recently.

\$10,442 Damages To Mixed Couple

TALLAHASSEE — A mixed couple received \$10,442 damages by order of a federal court in a bus suit.

Tamiami Trail Tours was ordered to pay the damages to Rev. and Mrs. Grover C. Bullock of Jamaica who were attacked by a white man.

Bullock blamed the attack partly on the fact that his wife was white and partly on the fact that he was sitting at the front of the bus.

Bullock's face was damaged, his glasses and watch were broken and his wife was slapped in the altercation with the white man.

The couple had asked for \$505,000 damages from the bus line on the grounds that the company should have warned him of the possible consequences of his riding in the front seat.

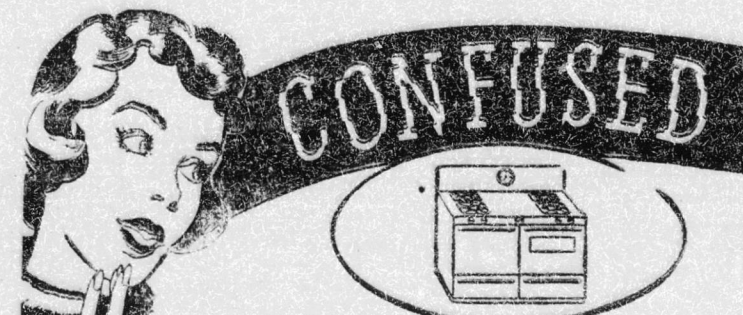

Archbishop Warns Racists

DURBAN, South Africa — Archbishop Denis Hurley, archbishop of Durban, predicted recently that a violent social and political revolution will shake South Africa if white supremacists do not "abolish color restrictions voluntarily."

"The color bar has got to go, peacefully or violently," the archbishop declared. "A time comes when — with or without organization ability — a people reaches the end of what it can take in injustice and humiliation breaks out in a great elemental eruption or resentment," he continued.

"If the white race wants any say in the future running of this country, it will retain that say by leading the non-whites to equality and not by raising obstacles in their path," the Catholic prelate concluded.

American Attitudes Create Uneasiness

ARUSHA, Tanganyika — Whites in Africa are criticizing American attitudes toward racism in Africa. They claim that America aims at ending British influence on the continent.

Criticisms have multiplied since Tom Mboya's visit to the United States recently. The whites are fearing that America is listening to a one-sided story from the Africans who visit the country. They regard attitudes of American politicians as means to winning political positions.

An editorial in a Kenya newspaper said: "People of all races with great experience of Africa will watch with somewhat cynical eyes American attempts to gather for themselves some of the influence they are only too eager to strip

from Britain." The racists in Africa have criticized the communist countries similarly.

Duvalier To Resume Duty

PORT AU PRINCE, Haiti — President Francois Duvalier is expected to return to his office next week, according to a recent announcement by Clement Barbot, executive secretary to the President.

The National Palace reported that the President had sufficiently recovered to resume his administrative duties.

M. Barbot has been acting for the President since his collapse caused by a heart attack on May 25.

Physician Returns To Quietude

NEW YORK CITY — Dr. Mark Poole and his nurse-trained wife left for the Congo recently to resume their careers as flying medical missionaries.

Dr. Poole decided that Africa was safer and quieter than New York City in spite of its wild animals, heat, humidity, and disease.

The doctor, a Texan whose father was a banker and cat-fleman, was on a brief medical leave to have an operation.

U. S.-Owned Land Occupied By Cuban

HAVANA, Cuba — A total of 182,733 acres of United States-owned property has been occupied by Cuban Government troops in Camaguey Province, according to reports by a Nation Cattle Association spokesman.

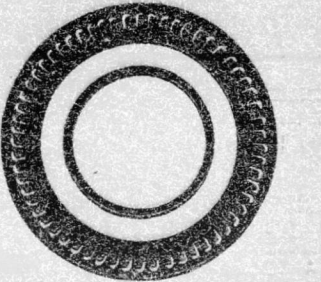

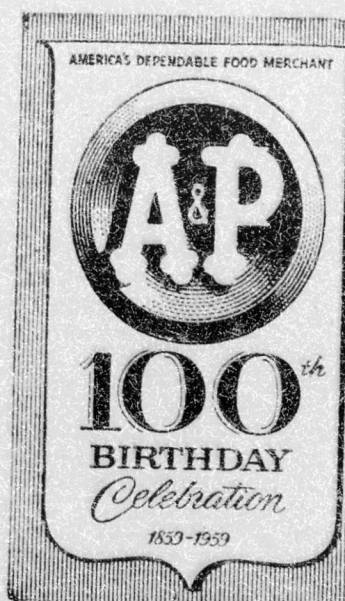
