

Marshall Butler's Inventions Acclaimed By Many

National Beauticians' Organization Starts Making Plans For Confab

Marshall E. Butler of 709 East Lenoir Street is a rear combination of God-fearing man and scientific-inventor. For he believes whatever he has successfully invented or experimented on—whether it be constructing electro-magnetic wave contraptions or changing the characteristics of cells in plants and animals—is possible only through the approval of God.

Among his small library of books in electronics, biology, radio repairs, and accounting is his Bible which never seems to have a chance to collect dust and is always present for ready reference in "clearing up a point" of his beliefs.

The most recent addition to the Butler family of inventions is a fire detecting gadget which sets off an alarm automatically when its "magic eye" discerns smoke within a certain area. Butler made the device as the result of a friend's expressed hope that such a safety medium be made.

Asked what started him off on his hobby of inventing, Butler answered with one word: necessity. He then went on to relate an experience in his early life.

"People used to steal milk left on my porch in the mornings," he started, "so I decided to find

a way to end the problem." All he did was make a box that would lock itself when a bottle of milk was placed in it. When he came out for milk in the morning, he would unlock the box with a key. That eliminated that problem. "You see, it was sheer necessity."

He gave another example of necessity: When he was employed by the North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Company he had to "work out arrears." "It was a tough job which took a lot of time," he observed. All he did to minimize the problem this time was to make a clock-like contraption which would compute arrears by the turning of clock-like hands to designated figures and dates. Simple... it was a just matter of necessity.

But Marshall Butler's hobbying transcended the "necessary" and wound up into changing the characteristic of cells in animal and plant life. His experimentations up to date have yielded such wonders as changing the pigmentation of the skin of fish, keeping bread, 18 years old, from molding or deteriorating, causing frozen corn to grow, and changing the color of flowers. Fantastic... but true! Not only can he prove his point by showing the objects of his experimentations, he can go into lengthy discussions which explain details of his procedures.

There is no special magic for-

mula to all of the incredible findings, but the one factor that creates most of the mystery in his work is the electro-magnetic wave.

Currently, he is experimenting on the degree of productivity of corn which has been treated with electro-magnetic waves and is now growing in his backyard.

Butler believes that radio waves can be applied in many instances to plant and animal life thereby causing them to change their characteristics and result in increased productivity or decrease.

The 53-year-old inventor contends that the medical and biological worlds have much to gain by delving into the possibilities of radio waves. Radio waves

(same as electro-magnetic waves) can soothe the nerves, relieve colds, stop common head and stomach aches. At least, so he believes and is willing to try to prove.

I read a letter addressed to Mr. Butler in which a friend enclosed a magazine clipping about cancer. The friend had observed that cancer researchers stumbled on an idea expressed by Butler years ago. An excerpt from the clipping under the sub-heading "Electric Force May Stop Cell Division" read:

"The electric force is a highly versatile tool. By interfering with chromosomes the force can create mutations—changes in inherited characteristics — that can be controlled."

But that's no new idea to Mar-

shall Butler. That's precisely what he has been working on for more than 20 years. Of course, he does not have an M.D. degree but if given the chance, no doubt he would try at "cracking down" on the ghastly disease.

Speaking of degrees, Mr. Butler can account for only six years of formal education plus correspondence courses in radio repairs and electronics which help him with his hobby.

He is a church-going citizen, married with one boy.

Mr. Butler is proving to the world once again that clear minds in sound bodies and less formally educated heads have characterized many of the greatest inventors known to man.

To the wandering individual who stumbles into his basement, there is an appearance of disorder — electronic repair parts strewn all over the place, nameless gadgets and contraptions sitting on tables and shelves in the most congested manner, jars of plants, animals and food and all manner of tools hanging from walls and lying loosely on tables, and just a little space to turn around in. But sit for a while in this jumble and listen to him as he explains his works and suddenly the unsightly place trans-
