

NEW YORK, N. Y -A proposed plan for the redevelopment of the 125th Street area of Harlem, including facilities for transportation, recreation, business, education, and housing, was outlined on July 21 at the New York University Graduate 'School of Public Administration and Social Service.

The plan is the result of a pine-month study conducted by students in the School's advanced urban planning design class taught by Robert C. Weinberg, adjunct professor of


