

City Riots After Cops Asks Man To Produce Identification

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP)—Forty policemen armed with nightsticks and fire hoses and using vicious police dogs, broke up a riot which flared up recently when two white detectives sought to question a Negro resident.

Robert L. Price, 26, reportedly resorted to physical violence when questioned by police. A crowd gathered and soon joined in the melee, when police reinforcements arrived.

Police Chief William Preet, attempting to justify the rigid policing of area residents, said all policemen have been ordered to ask identification of any person found on the streets at a late hour, as a move to halt the wave of muggings plaguing the city. The order is for the citizens' benefit and protection, he claimed.

At least 300 persons engaged in the stone and bottle-throwing free-for-all. One woman, a Negro, who reportedly tried to strike a policeman.

Englishman Fined For Race Hates

LONDON (AP)—Frederick Lawrence Francis, a sewer man was fined \$14 in London recently for shouting the racial slogan, "Keep Britain White." It was the second time in 10 days that Francis was fined on this offense.

The police who arrested him stated that Francis stood on the street corner and shouted, "Keep Britain White, Throw the Blacks Out." There were a number of colored people about and they adopted a threatening attitude. He said he had to arrest Francis for his own safety.

Francis, who told the magistrate he had been fined \$14.00 the previous week for a similar offense, said that one of the colored men insulted him. This the magistrate refused to accept.

Detroit Church Faces Big Court Suit

DETROIT (AP)—The church in a swank section of the city, where Prophet James F. Jones recently conducted open air services, has been ordered to "pay up or be evicted."
