# Prisoner, 23, Chooses Death Over Jail

CHICAGO (AP)—While a horrified courtroom audience watched, a 23-year-old man who had just been sentenced to a year in prison Wednesday broke from his custodians and dived through an open eighth floor window to his death.  
The prisoner, Luther Robinson, 23, was accused by Mrs. Eula Robinson, no relation, of stealing two suitcases from her home.  
Judge George L. Quilici, who heard the testimony and pronounced sentence, was visibly shaken by the tragedy.  
"This is a terrible shock," he said. "It is the first time anything like this ever happened in my courtroom and I hope it is the last."  
Women screamed and men gasped when young Robinson lunged through the window. A man grabbed one leg as the prisoner crashed the pane, but had to let go because of Robinson's weight and momentum. His accuser became hysterical.  
The prisoner's body struck the "elevated" structure behind the 11th Street police headquarters, then fell to the ground. He was pronounced dead in nearby Louise Berg hospital.

# National Urban League Convention Date Named

NEW YORK — The National Urban League will hold its annual conference at the Sheraton-Park Hotel in Washington, D. C., Sept. 8-10. Over 500 persons, including delegates and visitors from 63 local Urban League affiliates across the country, are expected to attend.  
"Community Planning for Equal Opportunity" is the conference theme. The metropolitan area in change, strengthening family life in our cities, and school integration are among the topics that will be discussed at the meeting. The conference host is the Washington Urban League.  
Among the principal speakers are Secretary Arthur S. Flemming of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare; Joseph D. Lohman, treasurer of the State of Illinois; and Dr. Archibald J. Carey, Jr., chairman, President's Committee on Government Employment Policy. Dr. Carey is also Pastor of Quinn Chapel A.M.E. Church, Chicago.  
Others will include James E. Lash, executive vice-president, Action, Inc.; Robert W. Dowling, president, City Investing Company; Whitney M. Young, Jr., dean of Atlanta University's School of Social Work; Edwin C. Berry, executive director, Chicago Urban League; Charles S. Zimmerman, chairman, AFL-CIO Civil Rights Committee, and vice-president, International Ladies Garment Workers Union; Frank L. Stanley, President, Louisville Defender; Al Hartnett, secretary-treasurer of the International Union of Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers, AFL-CIO; and Albert F. Watters, vice-president, General Foods Corporation.  
The annual conference will be preceded by a three-day institute for Urban League staff and board members.  
The National Urban League is an interracial organization devoted to improving economic opportunities for Negroes in urban areas and bettering race relationships. It was founded in 1910. The League's president and executive director, respectively, are Theodore W. Kheel and Lester B. Granger.  
Dr. R. Frank Jones, medical director of Freedman's Hospital, Washington, D. C.; and William H. Baldwin, partner of the New York public relations firm of Baldwin &

Sponsored by the United States National Student Association and held on the campus of the University of Illinois, the congress will feature two weeks of lectures and workshops.  
Hampton's 2 delegates are Thurman M. Davis, Raleigh, N. C., president of the Hampton student body, and Gloria Halthman, Fayetteville, N. C., who was elected at the 1958 congress to the post of educational affairs regional officer for the Virginia-North Carolina-South Carolina area.  
Other Hampton students scheduled to attend are: Barbara Cooper, Portsmouth, Va., vice president of the Hampton student body; Donnie Everett, Franklin, Va., editor of the "Hampton Script", student newspaper; Lois Martin, Norfolk, Va.; Kennell Jackson, Farmville, Va.; and Lucy R. Thornton, West Point, Va.  
Among subjects to be covered in lectures and forums at the congress are: The Next Decade in Higher Education; The Self-Educating Student; Educational and Human Freedoms; Problems of East-West Exchange and Effective Honor Systems. In conjunction with the congress a fourth national workshop for deans and advisors, a ninth student body presidents' conference and a third student editorial affairs conference will be held.  
Hampton Institute is authorized, by virtue of its 1,250 undergraduate enrollment, to send two delegates to the congress.  
The organization has estimated that delegations from 650 U. S. colleges, as well as guest-students from 27 foreign
