Failure to protect the eyes in bright sunlight leads to a possible loss of night vision. You can't see sufficiently to drive safely. The bright sunlight uses up "visual purple," a chemical on the retina of the eye. When the retina is exposed to excessive sunlight, normal seeing power is reduced, say researchers for the Murine Co. 
