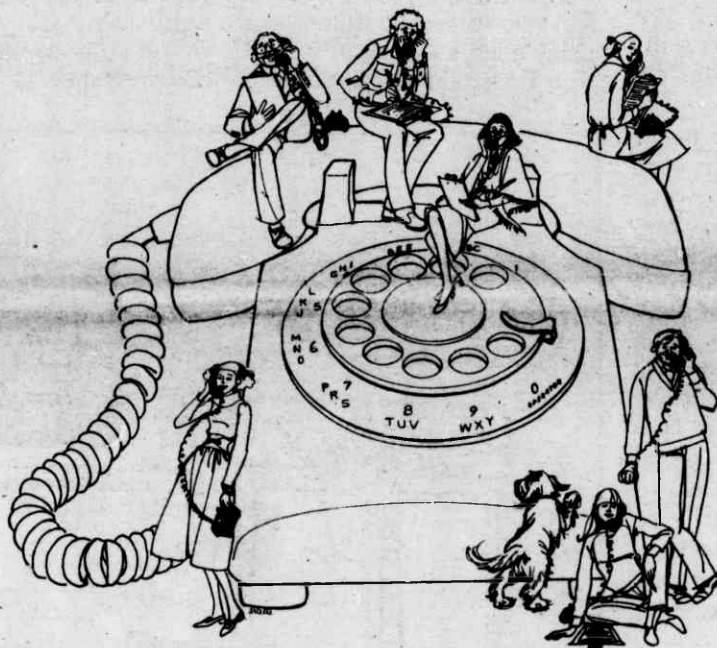
The Charlotte Jewish Federation invites the members of the Jewish community to participate in a regional mission to Washington. This is a unique opportunity for an inside view of how America's political leaders view the critical issues of concern to the Jewish people both in the United States and abroad. The mission will feature briefings by high-level officials from the White House, Congress, the Israeli Embassy and AIPAC. It will include lunch on capitol hill, dinner, hotel accommodations, and tickets to the Itzhak Perlman - Vladimir Askenazi concert at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

This Washington mission provides participants with an opportunity to explore an "insiders" view of the power centers of our nation's capital. It is unique in that men and women from Charlotte will be together with others in the southeast region who share their interests and concerns.

The trip will take place on Thursday and Friday, February 25 and 26 and has thoughtfully been planned so that anyone who wishes many stay on in Washington for the weekend. The cost is \$125.00 per person, not including transportation. The federation office will be happy to make plane reservations for those interested in participating. This mission is open to any man or woman giving a minimum gift of \$1000.00 to the 1982 U.J.A.-Federation campaign.
