Remembering The Holocaust In Germany

BONN (JTA) - A rabbi who immigrated to Israel from the Soviet Union has called on the German public to help him find an unknown Wehrmacht officer who, the rabbi said, risked his life to supply bread and other food to starving inmates at a Nazi forced labor camp during World War II.

Rabbi Zvi-Elimelech Schoenfeld recalls the incident in a book he has written on his wartime experiences.

Chinese Not Anti-Semitic

BEIJING, China (JTA) -Despite the People's Republic of China's dismal foreign policy record with regard to Israel, there is no Chinese anti-Semitism here. Neither Jews nor anti-Semitism exist for the citizens and government of China.

BONN (JTA) - Harm Menken, a 46-year-old teacher at the government-run navigation school in Stade, Lower Saxony, has been ordered dismissed for disseminating anti-Semitic propaganda in 1979. Menken claimed that the gas chambers were a lie and, in articles in local newspapers, accused Jews of preparing a plot to annihilate the German pec ple. Government authorities in Lower Saxony took no disciplinary measures against Menken until forced to by public opinion. When the matter was finally brought to the court, the punishment asked for was a 10 percent cut in his salary for an 18-month period. The panel of judges ordered him fired.

Anti-Semitism In France

PARIS (JTA) - Anti-Semitism in contemporary France is increasingly hiding under the guise of anti-Zionism or political opposition to Israel, according to a study on modern anti-Semitism in France. Traditional rightwing anti-Semitism "has been

seriously diminished" although it still plays an occasional role, mainly in attacking prominent Jewish personali-

"The real danger, nowadays, stems from certain leftist groups for whom the State of Israel is the root of all evil.'

PARIS (JTA) - Recently a terrorist on a motorcycle hurled a bomb into the Jewishowned Oree du Bois restaurant in the fashionable Bois du Boulogne section injuring 30 patrons, several of them children.

PARIS (JTA) - Frederic Oriach, a pro-Palestinian leftwing extremist linked to terrorists here, was sentenced to five years' imprisonment by a Paris court.

Oriach, 30, was carrying a list of Israeli offices in Paris and the addresses of French companies doing business with Israel when he was arrested. Four of the businesses had been targets of terrorist bombings. Leaflets claiming responsibility for the bombings were found in Oriach's

Illinois Mandates Public Disclosure Of Gifts To State Universities By Foreigners

CHICAGO (JTA) — Illinois has become the first state to mandate public disclosure of gifts made to state universities by foreign governments or foreign persons.

"In enacting Public Act 83-0641, Illinois has taken substantial steps to protect its schools from becoming educational conduits for the prejudices or biases of certain foreign donors." The Act requires disclosure for all monies in excess of \$100,000 made to state institutions of higher education by foreign governments or individuals., The source and purpose of each gift, and any conditions on its use, are included in the disclosure.

UJA Production Wins Gold Medal At International Film—TV Festival

NEW YORK (JTA) "Partners in Faith," a multimedia production written, composed, directed and produced by Issachar Miron, United Jewish Appeal creative consultant, won the top Gold Medal at the 26th Annual Awards competition of the International Film and TV Festival. It was chosen from more than 4,000 entries submitted by film makers from some 40 countries.

"Casting Light," and "San Francisco, My San Francisco, Is Jerusalem by the Golden Gate," films also written, composed and directed by Miron, won Bronze and Silver Medals, respectively, at the 25th Festival in 1982.

Miron is a laureate of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers' Deems Taylor award for creative writing, and a winner of Israel's Engel Music Prize.

Wolf Foundation Prize Winners In Mathematics Announced

TEL AVIV (JTA) - A Chinese-American and a Hungarian are to share the \$100,000 Wolf Foundation Prize in mathematics for 1983/84.

Prof. Shiing Chern, of the University of California in Berkeley, was cited for his outstanding contributions to "global differential geometry, which have profoundly influenced all mathematics.

Prof. Paul Erdos of the Mathematical Institute of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in Budapest, considered a "roving ambassador of mathematics, "having lectured throughout the world, was nominated for his "numerous contributions to number theory, combinatorics, probability, set theory, and mathematical analysis, and for personally stimulating methematicians the world over." He lived principally in the U.S. between 1938 and 1954.
