Childfind at Eastland Mall

On October 25 and 26, Ha Lailah Chapter B'nai B'rith Women distributed CHILD-FIND kits and information on missing children at the community booth at Eastland Mall.

The CHILD-FIND kits which sell for \$8 are packets of information telling parents what to do if a child is missing and also provides record-keeping information. A card in the packet is sent to CHILD-FIND where the information is kept on computer for use in case of an emergency. Representatives of the Charlotte Police Department were also present to talk to parents.
