For me, this immersion in Yiddish was an opportunity I hadn't had since sitting at my Bubba (grandmother) and Zaidy's (grandfather's) table as a child...I'd like to thank you all for enabling me to travel to North Carolina, experience your doromdike gastfreindlechkite (southern hospitality) and study Yiddish with you. Ah shey-

nem dank aich (thank you)...I'm spreading the word about North Carolina's incredible Yiddishists and hope that by next year we will have quite a bunch coming down from the area...I'll keep you informed. Once again, ah sheynem dank, let's keep in touch.
