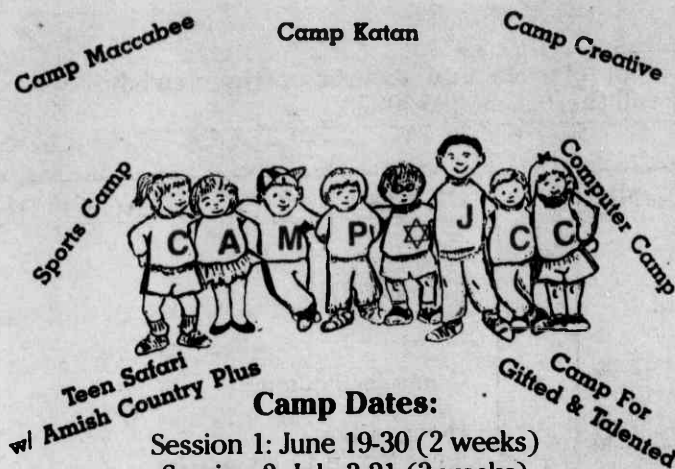
We are pursuing local college and high school coaches to enhance our JCC Sports Camp programs.
