

What may have begun as a slogan, ended as a battle cry and the reenergization of this 3,000 mostly women attendees of an international organization of over 385,000 members

The first evening's excitement began with a special video greeting from Israel's Prime Minister, Yitzhak Rabin, followed by such illustrious speakers as Wolf Blitzer, CNN Senior White House Correspondent. Professor Shmuel Penchas, Director General of Hadassah Medical Organization, gave a rousing address concerning the humanitarian aid Hadassah carries out throughout the world, helping Jew and Centile alike; trauma specialists sent to help those in the terrorist attack in Buenos Aires. How many areaware that four out of the nine doctors in Rwanda are from Hadassah hospital, which set up the first and only field operating hospital in this highly distressed area? I learned about these and many other mitzvot created by Hadassah.

Many workshops from Jewish Education to Zionist and American Affairs (with some heated discussions re the "religious right"), were held during the convention and showed the diversity of concerns and interests of its membership. There was literally "something for everyone."

Several new programs were introduced. One such educational program for children called, "Gal Gallim....," is a structured plan of lessons to help mothers and fathers teach their children through words and music about the Jewish holidays, Hebrew letters, etc. I have to say, this one was really an awful lot of fun!

## Hadassah and Temple Israel to Co-Sponsor Hebrew Classes


Beginning Friday, September 23, and continuing forward, the Charlotte chapter of Hadassah, in conjunction with Temple Israel, began offering Modern Hebrew classes. Roz Cooper is teaching the classes, which focus on developing skills in both reading and understanding Modern Hebrew. The course curriculum, known as Ivrit la Hadassah, was designed and developed by the National Hadassah organization, and uses what is called the "Whole Language Approach" to learn. This method immerses students in both reading and conversational exercises. Prior knowledge of Hebrew is neither necessary nor required for taking this course.

Classes will meet weekly at Temple Israel in Friday mornings from 9:30 - 11:00 a.m. The fee is \$25 and covers the cost of materials needed for the course. Class size will be limited to 12.
