In her faded jeans, black leather jacket and Converse hightops, Flora Tartakovsky appears to be a typical American teenager. Sprightly and streetwise, she participates in numerous school organizations, loves animals, ballet and tennis and enjoys hanging out with friends. But this 18 yearold's penchant for hard work and voracious appetite for knowledge have earned her the most prestigious science award given to American high school students: a Westinghouse scholarship.

At age 3 she immigrated with her family to escape anti-Semitism in their native Ukraine and attributes her academic accomplishments to the example set by her parents when they came here from Odessa 15 years ago. "They came to this country with an attitude of 'I want to go out there and work. I want to make something of myself.' I guess that's where I got my influence from, says Flora

While a future career in sci-

ence and medicine is a distinct possibility, for now science is just one among many of the disciplines she plans to explore during college. After being accepted at a number of Ivy League schools, Flora has chosen to attend Harvard University.

She said "I think...it can only be a benefit to have the experience of another culture, and I really appreciate the fact that besides being an American, I'm also a Russian and I'm also Jewish and that gives me a nice mixture of everything.

This award (the Westinghouse) is something that's just gonna last me a lifetime. I mean, to work so arduously at something and to be able to get recognized for it is just wonderful."




