The convention program, organized around the theme "Preserving the Past, Embracing the Future", included workshops on cataloging and Internet navigation; and demonstrations of the latest library software.

The convention featured a storytelling festival and an introductory course on collection development for the small Judaica library. A joint session of the American Library Association and the Association of Jewish Libraries entitled "Connecting Libraries: Exploring the Relationships Between "Secular" and Jewish Resources and Services" concluded the convention.



Debbie had recently returned with her family from living on a kibbutz in israel-coincidentally, Stanley and I were then approaching our fortieth wedding anniversary.

Knowing that charitable donations were always part of our family gift-giving custom, Debbie planned in secret with husband Peter, brothers Danny and wife Missy and Joe and wife Deborah to "seed" a Tulman Library Fund in our honor. The special stipulation for this fund would be that all

books or periodicals acquired through it must be published in Israel. Thus, in a small way, each donation to the Tulman Library Fund (which can still be as small as \$5.00 to have a card sent to the recipient) helps the publishing industry in Israel and the Speizmam Library here. In addition to books, the weekly international edition of the Jerusalem Post is purchased with interest accumulated from this fund Librarian Amalia Warshenbrot reported that individuals make good use of these newspapers in their study of world events.

It does our hearts good to see that our family values are being perpetuated by another generation ("dor l'dor"). It also thrills us to be honored by such a generous gesture during our lifetime, rather than be memorialized by it after we're gone.
