As a new year begins, I wish introduce the Speizman Jewish Library to newcomers and reintroduce it to the many people who walk through the library door. (Librarians call them library patrons.) The Speizman Jewish Library is open to all "y'all!" It serves synagogue and JCC members at no charge. Others are required to give a refundable deposit for security, but are certainly welcome. Most of our patrons are the Hebrew school students, their teachers, and the JCC staff. We also receive daily requests from the non-Jewish community. These inquiries come form college and public school students, members of the clergy, and people who want information about our religion, history or language. Many are using the Speizman Jewish Library for research on the Holocaust and Israel. Now that I have explained the "who," the "what" is simple.

What kind of books will you find in the Speizman Jewish Library? Our collection includes fiction and non-fiction. We have reference books with Jewish content and books by Jewish authors for all ages. We also have Jewish magazines.

Where are we located? We are in the JCC building in the Education Wing, in a location convenient to the Hebrew

When are we there? Our hours of operation revolve around all the school hours. When the schools are in session the library hours are: Sunday 8:30 am - 1:00 pm; Tuesday and Thursday 11:00 am - 12:30 pm and 2:00 pm - 5:45 pm; Wednesday 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm.

Sometimes we close the library for twenty minutes so the Librarian can give undivided attention to children who come

for story time or research. At such times, you will find a sign on the door with the session date and time. We realize this may inconvenience some patrons, but hope you will understand that we are trying to meet everyone's needs. At other times, you will find the door open to you.


