



Preliminary reports from Houston indicate that the following sports may be offered: Baseball, Basketball, Bowling, Chess, Cross Country, Dance, Golf, Gymnastics, Racquetball, Soccer, Softball, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Track & Field and Volleyball. Once again, interested athletes will be able to participate in only one (1) sport plus either the cross country and or track & field competitions.

Based on the overwhelming success of the 1998 JCC Maccabi Games here in Charlotte and the 137 member Team Charlotte 1998 local delegation, we would love to be able to send at least 60+ Charlotte athletes to represent our local community in this international special event. It is anticipated that between 1000-1200 Jewish teenagers will be hosted in Houston.
