**Hebrew High Creates Website** 

**Inauguration of Monument to 13 Charlotte Jewish Boys** 

Only nine Jewish families lived here when the Civil War broke

From among them no fewer than 13 teenagers volunteered to fight for the Confederacy. They became heroes, wrote diaries, were taken prisoner, died of wounds and disease — or lived to raise families here.

For the first time in 136 years the Charlotte Jewish community is going to honor those 13 boys at 2:00 PM Sunday, November 18.

Rabbi Murray Ezring and Cantor Elias Roochvarg of Temple Established Wolfer and the religious ceremonies. Larry Walker will lead more than 50 uniformed descendants of Confederate soldiers in military ceremonies. Mayor Pat McCrory has been invited to speak.

Educators, historians, civic and eligious leaders of all faiths are also being invited to the Hebrew

Cemetery at 1908 Statesville Road. Two monuments will be dedicated: a large memorial to all 13 soldiers and a special one at the grave of Captain Julius Roessler, the highest ranking Civil War Charlotte soldier.
