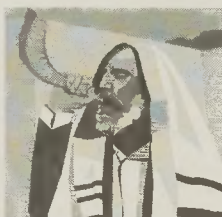

Havurat Tikvah, which has held lay-led High Holiday services since 1989, will celebrate its "bar mitzvah" year this September by again opening its services to the community. The chavurah, now an affiliate of the Jewish Reconstructionist Federation, draws on members to lead portions of the service, read Torah and provide d'var Torah, assisted by veteran members and resident rabbinic intern Dr. Laura Kaplan.

Main services, which blend traditional prayers and songs with liturgy from the Jewish Renewal movement and Reconstructionism, are held in the sanctuary of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Charlotte at 234 N. Sharon Amity Rd.
