

According to an article just published in the journal Cancer Prevention Research, the new screening test is 95% accurate.

Stem Cell Research for ALS Moves Forward at Hadassah Medical Center - Israel's Ministry of Health recently approved "BrainStorm Cell Technologies, Inc." accelerating to a Phase II trial, following the positive safety evaluation of the Phase I/II trial at Hadassah Medical Center in Jerusalem. This next round will evaluate the safety and preliminary efficacy of BrainStorm's NurOwn stem cell therapy candidates; trials are being conducted by Hadassah Medical Organization.

Our work remains central to Israel's well-being; this commitment drives the support from our members, associates, volunteers, and donors
